GRADUATED FROM EDGAR HIGH SCHOOL IN 1943

Bud enlisted in the U.S. Navy and spent time in England and France. After being released from active duty in Sept. 1946 with rank of petty officer second class, he served several more years in the Navy Reserve. Bud then worked with his father, Anton, in the family business - Country Home Locker. After ten years he took over the business and operated it full time until 1974. He then worked for Marathon Electric, retiring in 1989.

Bud has been a member of Edgar's Veterans of Foreign Wars, serving as Post Commander from 1980-1982 and again from 1990-1991. He served two terms on the Edgar School District Board of Education and was more recently involved in a citizen committee supporting a bond referendum, which was approved. Bud served on the Marathon County Board of Supervisors three times and has been active in centennial planning for the Town of Cassel and Village of Edgar.

Bud has been very active in the Edgar Lions Club, serving in several offices as well as his 20 years of service as a volunteer eye tissue transporter. In 1992, the Edgar Jaycees named him Edgar Area "Citizen of the Year".
