Operational Referendum: NEXT STEPS

verall we are still very concerned with the status of our school district budget. We have currently presented a budget that has no room for growth in our educational opportunities for our students, no room for annual maintenance projects, let alone any unexpected maintenance issues. Ultimately, the needs for our students have not gone away, along with, decreasing revenues, rising costs of inflation, and the need to retain and recruit high quality staff makes it very difficult to meet these needs of our students.



With this said, we will continue to move forward with an operational referendum again in the spring of 2022. Our next steps in this process are as follows:

- Form an Advisory Committee with Community Members
- Review Priorities and Costs
- > Determine an Operational Referendum Timeline (February OR April 2022)
- > Determine a Recurring OR Non-recurring Referendum
- > Determine Length and Dollar Amount of Referendum

Our immediate goal is to create our Advisory Committee. This committee will meet quarterly, review goals, findings and costs, and review operating priorities. Please consider being a member of this committee. Your support and help will be appreciated.

Pride and Tradition: Edgar FFA Returns to Fishing in Minnesota

The Edgar FFA trip to Canada has been a part of the organization for more than 40 years. The trip originally started as a three-day fishing trip to northern Wisconsin in the early 1970's and then progressed to what it is today. Due to the pandemic, the trip was cancelled in 2020 for the first time in decades. With the Canadian border still closed to Americans for non-essential trips the Edgar FFA did the next best thing by heading to northern Minnesota.





The 2021 Canada Trip, Minnesota Edition, took place on Ash Lake just outside Orr, MN. Twenty four FFA members and chaperones participated in the week long fishing trip. The goal is always to be safe and catch lots of fish to eat and we accomplished just that. The fishing was a little different than Canada as Walleye and Northern Pike proved to be elusive in Minnesota. Our group spent the week dining on large perch, bluegill, and crappie fish. It was noticeable that pan fish and other species of fish are considerably larger in Ash Lake. Our fishing highlights included a 20" smallmouth bass, 12.5" bluegill, 12" perch, and 13.5" crappie. Even though we hardly caught walleye and northern pike, we managed to reel in a 19" walleye and a 26" northern pike.

The fishing was excellent and this trip will go down as one of the hottest on record. Temperatures were in the upper 80's and low 90's all week. We were saved by the fact we had several cabins that had air conditioning, a perk we normally do not have in Canada. I am very proud of my students and thankful for wonderful chaperones to make the trip a success. Although we enjoyed our time, we look forward to returning to Mit Lake in Canada for 2022.

A Historic Perspective

The FFA Canada trip evolved as a way to get students involved in FFA activities. Very little is known pre-1973, but earning a trip to Canada has always revolved around member involvement. In order to qualify for the fishing trip, student have to earn points by participating in fruit sales, seed corn and magazine sales, speaking contests, fair, and FFA Alumni events.

After 1973, the late Dennis Schraufnagel, who was an agriculture instructor at Edgar High School and an avid walleye angler, worked with students throughout the year by getting them involved in planning and preparing for the trip. Starting at the beginning of the school year, he would have students save deer tails from hunting season to make fishing lures in class. After all the jigs were made by dying the deer hair different colors, he would teach students how to use the colored hair to make the lures most attractive for catching walleye.

The trip always begins the last Friday of the school year with the group leaving Edgar at 4 o'clock a.m. In the early days there would be a stop at KFC in Ashland to enjoy one last non-fish meal before

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hitting the lake. Today, that meal is Subway in Ignace, Ontario, Canada. The final destination has always been Mit Lake north of Ignace. This area was chosen because it is fairly close to town and has ample camping for a group our size. The lake provides a bounty of walleye and northern pike.

After a week of fishing the tradition has always been a stop at Kakabeka Falls near Thunder Bay, Ontario. The water falls approximately 131 feet and is a marvel to visit. Early members recall walking a dirt path to stand on the edge of the falls taking pictures, but today there are boardwalks and fee areas to safely see the falls.



Although Agriculture Instructors and stops en route to Mit Lake have changed over the years, the core of the trip has stayed the same over 40 years. That is truly remarkable if you think about it. I am honored to carry on the tradition for years to come.

Budget Hearing and Annual Meeting Recap

On Wednesday, June 30th the School District of Edgar held the budget hearing and annual meeting. We would like to thank the four community members that attended to hear the information that was presented. During the presentation of the proposed budget there were several items discussed as both projected and historical data. These items were: tax levy, district revenues and expenses, fund balance, head count, FTE, open enrollment, and class enrollment. The 2021-22 Revenue Worksheet was also reviewed in detail. Overall, we are still very concerned with the status of our school district budget. We have been fortunate to be able to "balance" the budget with the one-time use of the Federal Covid Funds (ESSER Funds). Unfortunately, these funds were not intended to be used to "balance" school district budgets, but for Edgar that is our reality. Over the past five years, the School District of Edgar has lost approximately \$398,000 in revenue limit. This loss is significant as it impacts our students and cannot be recovered without the help of the community. With that said, we are asking our Edgar Community to be engaged, become involved in, and continue to support the school district. We need your help. The future, our students, are in your hands.

Softball Has a Strong Season

The Edgar Softball team concluded an impressive season. Finishing with an overall record of 14-7 (best since 2009), a Conference Record of 7-3, and in a tie for 2nd place with Auburndale in the Marawood Conference. The team notched impressive wins including a win over Conference Champion Wisconsin Rapids Assumption as well as a sweep of Stratford. The season concluded with a playoff loss to a strong Auburndale team during the Regional Tournament.
