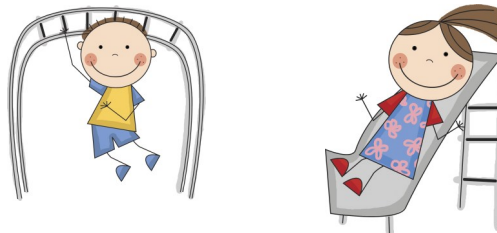

# Early Childhood Information

## Supplies

Students attending in-school programs should bring a school bag or back pack each day. A folder for important notes and papers is recommended. A change of clothes and diapers (if needed) should be kept in the school bag.

Each child should provide one box of tissues, two containers of baby wipes and a glue stick to be kept and used at school.



## Snack
