Frank Joswick retired after 35 years as Pulaski Schools District Administrator. His first efforts were directed toward attracting a larger student population, one which grew from 120 to 3000 students, working to reorganize the school system into a K-12 comprehensive district, and communication with the community.

Mr. Joswick promoted the publication on the Pulaski News. He was a leader in organizing Pulaski Industries, provided long time service to the Brown County Commission on Aging and Housing Commissions. He also founded the Tri-County Medical Clinic, was on the board of directors of St. Mary's Hospital, Green Bay, and was honored with the Medical Service Award from the Brown County Medical Society.

Upon retirement in 1970 he was recognized by the Wisconsin Association of School District Administrators with their Outstanding Educator Award. Following retirement Mr. Joswick was elected to the Village Board, became manager of the local canning company and provided leadership to construction of housing and other services to senior citizens.

Mr. Joswick was married to the former Theresa Murkowski in the Town of Cassel and their children are Robert, Thomas, Rosemarie and Charlene.
