Policy

- 1. Policy #5113: Open Enrollment Program—determining annual capacity/space for Regular Education and Special Education
 - a. According to DPI Open Enrollment guidelines, school districts should establish the number of Regular and Special Education open enrollment spaces annually in January. In collaboration with MCSE, we prepared three options for our district to evaluate. The School Board approved Option #2 for our space capacity. Our current capacity and projected capacity states there will not be any room to accept Open Enrolled Special Education students for 2023-24. It was approved that students with disabilities be considered for open enrollment preference if they have siblings already attending the district. The preference would be permitted if the district has the program and services listed in the IEP. Our current capacity and projected capacity states there will be room to accept Open Enrolled Regular Education students for 2023-24.
- 2. Policy #0141.1: Student Representative at Board Meetings—The School Board approved this policy for 2nd Reading.
- 3. 2023-24 School Calendar -- Administratively, we developed three different options for school calendars for the 2023-24 school year and then the staff members were given a survey asking them for their feedback on choosing one of the two options. Calendar Option #2 was chosen by majority (68% with the other two choices combined at 32%) as the calendar to follow. Calendar Option #2: Very similar to this year's calendar with Spring Break the week of (March 25-29) Last day of school for students is on Thursday, May 30th and teacher inservice ½ day on Friday, May 31st. The School Board approved the 2023-24 School Calendar.
- 4. Act 55 Required Notice Updates
 - Educational Opportunities: School Districts that offer a Youth Apprenticeship Program are now required to list that option on the Educational Options document that is a required notice from the 2015-17 state budget (2015 Wisconsin Act 55). The School Board approved the updated document with the Youth Apprenticeship Program added.

Finance

- 1. A report was given regarding the ESSER funds and any changes that have been made. The School Board approved the changes that were presented. As a reminder the ESSER Funding Timelines are as follows:
 - i. ESSER I: Funding expires September 30, 2022
 - ii. ESSER II: Funding expires September 30, 2023
 - iii. ESSER III: Funding expires September 30, 2024
 - b. List Types of Programs Funding Can be Used for:
 - i. preparedness and response to COVID 19
 - ii. outreach and services to special populations
 - iii. addressing long-term closures (planning for, coordinating and implementing activities)

- iv. education technology
- v. mental health supports
- vi. addressing after-school and summer activities
- vii. continued staff employment
- viii. purchasing supplies to sanitize and clean the facilities
- ix. mitigate learning loss
- x. restore and maintain high quality learning environments
- c. ESSER III Requirements:
 - i. As required, DPI will distribute 90 percent of Wisconsin's ESSER III allocation to LEAs. The plan also includes three required earmarks for activities and interventions that respond to students' academic, social, and emotional needs and address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on underrepresented student subgroups, including each major racial and ethnic group, children from low-income families, children with disabilities, English learners, gender, migrant students, and students experiencing homelessness, and children and youth in foster care.
