Personnel

- 1. Staff Hires
 - a. Ms. Chloe Miland applied for and accepted the position as 3rd Grade Teacher for the 2023-24 school year. The interview team is excited to have Chloe join our team. The School Board approved.
- 2. FMLA Request
 - a. A staff member requested FMLA time off for approximately 5 days in April due to a medical procedure. The School Board approved.
- 3. Co-Curricular Hires
 - a. The School Board approved the following winter coaches:
 - i. 8th Grade Boys Basketball—Kevin Yessa
 - ii. 8th Grade Girls Basketball—Ashley Schilling
 - b. The School Board approved the HS Student Council Advisor—Mr. Greg Streit
- 4. CTE Field Experience Student
 - a. The School Board approved Mr. Shawn Steinke as CTE Field Experience Student. He needs to complete 50 hours with Mr. Streit in the Tech Ed Department.

Finance

- 1. Finalize 2023-24 District Budget
 - a. The School Board approved the Budget 2023-24.
- 2. Review Revenue Limit and State Aid
 - a. We are able to tax the difference between the Total Revenue Limit and the State Aid which equals \$1,674,475. We requested that we levy to our maximum. The School Board approved.
- Set Tax Levy
 - a. Our total levy decreased 19.2% and the Equalized Value increased 13.1% with a mil rate decrease of 28.6%. Several items contribute to this:
 - 1. Total Revenue Limit increased approx. \$431,000. This is due to the following factors.
 - 1. \$325 per pupil addition to the RL worksheet Line 4 per the biennial state budget
 - 2. FTE increase of 10 to our 3-year rolling average from the prior year Line 2

- Approx. \$70,000 increase to the private school voucher Line H –
 per the biennial state budget the voucher amount per student K-8
 increased \$1,475 and students 9-12 increased \$3,323 (15 Edgar
 resident students participate in the voucher program)
- 2. Equalized Property Value increased significantly this decreases the mill rate
- 3. Fund 39 Referendum debt levy is significantly less (approx. \$200,000) due to prior year over levys and this being the final year levying for the 2011 building referendum payments.
- 4. State Aid increased \$693,532 —this is one of the main reasons for the mill rate decrease
 - a. 2016-17 Equalized Aid = \$4,881,319.00
 - b. 2017-18 Equalized Aid = \$4,702,806.00
 - c. 2018-19 Equalized Aid = \$4,639,781.00
 - d. 2019-20 Equalized Aid = \$4,526,381.00
 - e. 2020-21 Equalized Aid = \$4,819,630.00
 - f. 2021-22 Equalized Aid = \$5,013,199.00
 - g. 2022-23 Equalized Aid = \$5,395,464.00
 - h. 2023-24 Equalized Aid = \$6,088,996.00

The School Board approved the tax levy of 0.00624014 which equates to \$6.24 per thousand of value (example: on a home valued at \$100,000 the school tax would be \$624.00 for the year)
