Paul Martin is currently a professor of Mathematics in the UWSP Mathematics Department. He has always enjoyed learning about science and mathematics, He recalls as a youngster sharing a bedroom with three brothers and the frequent conversations at bedtime about chemistry and math and other of their high school subjects. As siblings, they were always encouraged to engage their minds in school and in solving every-day problems on their family farm.

After high school Paul followed the path of siblings ahead of him to the UW at Wausau and then to UW-Madison.
