Dr. Karl Martin is Dean of the University of Wisconsin-Madison's Division of Extension. He is responsible for over 700 faculty and staff and over 15,000 volunteers located across Wisconsin's 72 counties, five tribal nations and five UW System campuses.

He graduated from Edgar High School in 1986 and pursued his undergraduate studies at UW-Marathon County and UW-Madison before leaving Wisconsin for his graduate studies at Oregon State University. Karl has a doctorate in forest ecology, a master's degree in wildlife science from Oregon State University and a bachelor's degree in wildlife ecology from UW-Madison.
