- a. Neola Updates: 1<sup>st</sup> Reading (November Updates: #0100, 7540, 7540.02, 7540.04, 7544)
  - i. Neola prepares updates and revisions to the policies throughout the year and then these updates are sent to me twice a year. The School Board recommended these updates for the 1<sup>st</sup> reading.
- b. 2020-21 School Calendar:
  - ii. Administratively, we developed three different options for school calendars for the 2020-21 school year and then the staff members were given a survey asking them for their feedback on choosing one of the three options. Calendar Option #1 was chosen by majority as the calendar to follow. The School Board approved the 2020-21 School Calendar. You can find the calendar on our district website.
- b. Early College Credit Program (ECCP): Courses for Spring 2020
  - a. The School Board approved the ECCP courses that our HS students will be taking for the Spring of 2020.

## Finance

1. CESA 9 Services Contract 2020-21
  - a. The School Board approved the CESA 9 contract for 2020-21 for the amount of \$34,229.00. The services we purchase from CESA 9 will change slightly for next school year. We need to purchase the Reading Specialist services and not the Reading Specialist Consultation. Due to this change the projected costs are up from this year's cost of \$28,029.00 (+\$6,200.00)
2. CESA 10 Services Contract 2020-21
  - a. The estimated cost for the services for CWETN for 2020-21 is \$13,945.00. This is an increase of \$340 from the 2019-20 contract \$13,605.00. The School Board tabled this recommendation until the next Board Meeting.
