Staff/Student Presentations:

Mr. Tom McCarty, Mrs. Lisa Witt, and Dr. Cari Guden presented information on COVID in the schools. At the time of the presentation our dashboard showed zero current positive cases in the district. The district has had 79 total positive cases since Sept. 1, 2020 and only 18 of these 79 were from January 4th to present. Therefore, at this time we are seeing a decrease in cases. We have a few items at the elementary level that we will change for the month of April and then re-evaluate for May. We will allow grade-level cohorts for learning/teaching, for recess time, and for lunch time. (we currently have the grade levels split in half) There will be no changes at the MS/HS level. At the district level, we will continue to "close" the buildings to community and/or non-community people/events; however, we will begin to allow Edgar student groups/activities to use the building. Building use within these groups must follow these guidelines: all groups must stay in grade level cohorts in grades PK-8 (no mixing grade levels), masks are required, social distancing is highly recommended, no food to be made and served while in the building.

Dr. Cari Guden presented information on the upcoming referendum. Our main goal the last few months has been to communicate, communicate, and communicate. We want the community to be informed. We attended 15+ meetings to present information regarding the referendum, we have social media posts twice a week, we sent a backpack flyer home with all students, we continue to use the messaging system to keep the students/parents informed, we created an FAQ to inform the community of questions that we have received, and our district website is updated with information. There will also be a letter to the editor in the Record Review next week and a reminder to vote postcard will be sent to all box holders the week of March 29th.
