The purpose of the elementary WILDCAT NEWS is to keep you informed of the many great things happening in all of the classrooms as well as the elementary school. Please note the change in our parent pick-up line procedures for this school year. We will only be loading in the LOADING ZONE area for the safety of all students. When all students are loaded in the cars in the loading zone then all cars will be waved to drive away and the next group of cars we will be waved into the loading zone area. Please see the attached picture and notes for further clarification. We think you'll like our new procedures.

## ROUTINES AND PROCEDURES AT EDGAR

Safety is the primary goal when we look at routines and procedures at the elementary school. When students arrive at school in the morning they will all report to the cafeteria to gather at their grade level table and have breakfast (optional) until 8:00 A.M.

Students will eat at assigned lunch tables in their grade levels. They

will have 20 minutes for lunch and 25 minutes for noon recess.

Just a reminder that we ask that parents do not enter the building before or after school. We continue to offer the PARENT PICK-UP LINE for drop off before school and pick up after school. Please fill out the STUDENT PICK-UP form and return to the elemen-

tary office. You will receive a lime green visor family nametag that needs to be displayed on the dash of your car for pick up. If you need extra copies please indicate that on the form. Students are to enter the car from the curbside and NOT from the road side. Students will only load a car that is in the LOADING ZONE area.

## COMMUNICATION

Communication is critical to the success of your child at school!
Students in grades 2-5 will have daily planners that they keep their assignments in...please check your child's planner on a daily basis.

We ask that all parents be connected to SEESAW! This is a great

way for you to communicate with your child's teacher. You will receive messages from Edgar Elementary School as well.

Please call the school (715-352-2727) if your child will be absent. If we don't have a note or receive a phone call by 8:30 A.M. we will contact

you to verify that your child is absent from school.

Also, please call the elementary office by noon if you are changing the end of day pick up for your child. Teachers may not be able to check SEESAW during the day, so we prefer you call the elementary office.

## FRIDAY SALES

Every Friday the elementary school will be having a POPCORN sale or a FREEZE POP sale. These sales are sponsored by individual classrooms or the elementary school. All

money raised goes directly to the classroom or the elementary school for their special projects. We are looking for PARENT volunteers to help with these Friday sales! The popcorn volunteers are needed from 8:00-10:00 and the freeze pop volunteers are needed from 11:00-12:00.

# THE WILDCAT WAY

This year we will continue to focus on our FOUR expectations that we are teaching all of our students in grades EC-5th grade: BE RESPECTFUL, BE RESPONSIBLE, BE SAFE AND BE A FRIEND. We will continue to end the year with our ELEMENTARY AWARDS program by recognizing our STUDENT CITIZENS OF THE YEAR! GO WILDCATS!


## PICTURE DAY

## PARENT PICK-UP LINE PROCEDURES

- 1. OUR PARENT PICK-UP LINE PROCEDURES HAVE CHANGED FOR THIS SCHOOL YEAR. THE LOCATION ON EAST MAPLE STREET IS THE SAME, BUT THE PROCEDURES FOR LOADING A CAR HAVE CHANGED TO KEEP ALL STUDENTS SAFE.
  - WE WILL HAVE A LOADING ZONE AREA THAT WILL BE CLEARLY MARKED AND THAT IS THE ONLY AREA THAT STUDENTS WILL BE ABLE TO LOAD A VEHICLE.
  - WE WILL HAVE TWO ADULTS DIRECTING CARS TO ENTER THE LOADING ZONE AREA AND ALSO DIRECTING STUDENTS TO LOAD INTO CARS ON THE PASSENGER SIDE.
  - PLEASE SEE THE PICTURE ABOVE.
- 2. We ask that all parents utilizing the parent pick up line to pick up their child in a vehicle. If you walk to school to pick up your child we ask that you wait at the bottom of the ramp by the EDGAR ELEMENTARY sign.
- 3. We ask that no parent/adult get out of their vehicle while in the parent pick-up line. If you need to talk to the teacher we ask that you park your car in the parking lot after picking up your child and come into school to talk to the teacher.
- 4. Pick up will begin at 3:05 for elementary students. If you are also picking up a middle school or high school student we ask that you then drive to the high school to pick up your other child(ren).
- 5. All vehicles will need the lime green visor tag displayed on the dashboard on the passenger side.
- 6. If someone other than yourself is picking your child up or if you are picking up additional children from school, PLEASE call the elementary office to inform the office staff of your change.

## Notes from the Nurse Fall 2023 By Lara Beranek, RN

Many parents ask, "When is my child sick enough to stay home from school?"

This is not always an easy question to answer. We hope that these tips can help!

A child who is sick will not be able to perform well in school and is likely to spread the illness to other children and staff. We suggest making a plan for childcare ahead of time so you will not be caught without a comforting place for your child to stay if he/she is ill.

We ask that you keep your child home from school if he/she has:

- Fever (100 degrees or higher) in the past 24 hours
- Vomiting in the past 24 hours
- Diarrhea in the past 24 hours
- Chills
- Severe sore throat
- COVID (If a child tests positive for COVID, they should stay home and follow the return-to-school guidance of your local health department or healthcare provider)
- Strep Throat (must have been taking an antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school)
- Contagious skin condition (ex) impetigo, scabies (follow healthcare provider instruction on return-to-school)
- Drainage from the ear(s) or eye(s)
- Bad cold, with a <u>very runny nose</u> or <u>bad cough</u>, especially if it has kept the child awake at night
- Head lice until your child has been treated according to the nurse or doctor's instructions

If your child becomes ill at school and school staff feels the child is too sick to benefit from school or is potentially contagious to other children, you will be called to come pick them up from school. We will be sending students home for the same symptoms listed above.

Children may return to school when they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication, have had no vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours also without the use of medications, and other symptoms are significantly improved.

It is essential that the school office has a phone number where you can be contacted during the day and an emergency number in the event you cannot be reached. Please be sure that arrangements can be made to transport your child home from school and that childcare is available in case of illness. If your daytime or emergency phone number changes during the year, please notify the main office as soon as possible.

Please call the school health office if you have any questions or concerns.
