I truly enjoy seeing the smiles and excitement of all the students on the first day of school! Our goal is to capture that excitement for learning and school each and every day. Archie, our therapy dog, is super excited for the school year to begin as well!

The purpose of the WILDCAT NEWS is to keep you informed of the many greats things happening in all of the classrooms as well as the elementary school. We ask that you take a few minutes to look at the information contained in this newsletter. Next month, each grade level will have an article on the happenings in their classroom. We will not be sending home a paper copy of the newsletter, instead we'll send an announcement in SEESAW with the newsletter attached AND we will also post on the district website as well as Facebook. If you prefer a paper copy, please contact the elementary office, and we'd be happy to send a copy home with your child.

Please note that we are bringing back the PARENT MEETINGS. We believe that in order for your child to be successful at school we need a strong home-school connection. Please mark Monday, September 9 on your calendar. ALL grade levels will have two back-to-back parent meetings; one at 5:30 and the second at 6:15. We will provide daycare (all students can report to the playground) AND we will provide a meal (hot dog, chips, cookie and juice). Please RSVP to your children's teacher which time you will attend. This way, parents only have to come ONE night and can attend one or two meetings. We have lots of important topics to cover, so please make every attempt to attend.

ROUTINES AND PROCEDURES

Safety is the primary goal when we look at routines and procedures at the elementary school. When students arrive at school in the morning they will all report to the cafeteria to gather at their grade level table and have breakfast (optional) until 8:00 A.M.

Just a reminder that we ask that parents do not enter the building before or after school. We continue to offer the PARENT PICK-UP LINE for drop off before school and pick up after school. Please fill out the STUDENT PICK-UP form and return to the elementary office. You will receive a lime green visor family nametag that needs to be displayed on the dash of your car for pick up. If you need extra copies please indicate that on the form. Students are to enter the car from the curbside and NOT from the road side. Students will only load a car that is in the LOADING ZONE area.

If you are picking up your child and NOT in a vehicle we ask that you wait at the bottom of the ramp by the EDGAR ELEMENTARY SIGN. Once all students are outside with their class they will be released to you.

SAFETY is our number 1 priority. THANK YOU!

COMMUNICATION

Communication is critical to the success of your child at school! Students in grades 2-5 will have daily planners that they keep their assignments in...please check your child's planner on a daily basis. We ask that all parents be connected to SEE-SAW! This is a great way for you to communicate with your child's teacher. You will receive messages from Edgar Elementary School as well.

Please call the school (715-352-2727) if your child will be absent. If we don't have a note or receive a phone call by 8:30 A.M. we will contact you to verify that your child is absent from school. Also, please call the elementary office by noon if you are changing the end of day pick up for your child. Teachers may not be able to check SEESAW during the day, so we prefer you call the elementary office.

FRIDAY SALES

Every Friday the elementary school will be having a POPCORN sale or a FREEZE POP sale. These sales are sponsored by individual classrooms or the elementary school. All money raised goes directly to the classroom or the elementary school for their special projects. We are looking for PARENT volunteers to help with these Friday sales. that will feature our honored STUDENTS OF THE MONTH.


We will continue to end the year with our ELEMENTARY AWARDS program by recognizing our STUDENT CITIZENS OF THE YEAR! GO WILDCATS!

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- All grade levels will hold meetings simultaneously, so please choose a time that works best for you to attend your child(ren)'s parent meeting.
- Free daycare will be available on the playground during the meetings.
- A meal (hot dog, chips, cookie, juice/water) will be provided to all families attending outside on the playground.

RSVP: Please let your child's teacher know if you will attend the 5:30-6:00 PM meeting, the 6:15-6:45 PM meeting, or both.





PARENT PICK-UP LINE PROCEDURES

- 1. Parent pick-up line will start loading when ALL grades are outside. As SAFETY is our primary focus, please note the parent pick-up line procedures:
 - WE WILL HAVE A LOADING ZONE AREA THAT WILL BE CLEARLY MARKED AND THAT IS THE ONLY AREA THAT STUDENTS WILL BE ABLE TO LOAD A VEHICLE.
 - WE WILL HAVE TWO ADULTS DIRECTING CARS TO ENTER THE LOADING ZONE AREA AND ALSO DIRECTING STUDENTS TO LOAD INTO CARS ON THE PASSENGER SIDE.
 - PLEASE SEE THE PICTURE ABOVE.
- 2. We ask that all parents utilizing the parent pick-up line to pick up their child in a vehicle. If you walk to school to pick up your child we ask that you wait at the bottom of the ramp by the EDGAR ELEMENTARY sign.
- 3. We ask that no parent/adult get out of their vehicle while in the parent pick-up line. If you need to talk to the teacher we ask that you park your car in the parking lot after picking up your child and come into school to talk to the teacher.
- 4. We ask that if a child needs to be put in a carseat/booster seat that the parent be responsible for this.
- 5. Pick up will begin at 3:10 for elementary students. If you are also picking up a middle school or high school student we ask that you then drive to the high school to pick up your other child(ren).
- 6. All vehicles will need the lime green visor tag displayed on the dashboard on the passenger side.
- 7. If someone other than yourself is picking your child up or if you are picking up additional children from school, PLEASE call the elementary office to inform the office staff of your change.

Family Talk: Using the 14 Talking Tips at Home

Hello families,

We're in our first week of the LENA Grow program! As part of the program, we are using LENA's **14 Talking Tips**. These tips show simple ways to increase conversational turns with your child. Use them at home during any daily routine such as meals, reading, or playing. Any time is a good time to talk!

Conversational Turns

Back-and-forth talk between an adult and a child. Any speech-like sound, such as babbles or words, counts as a turn.

Even if your child is not using complete words yet, they can use sounds and actions to communicate with you. These interactions are the building blocks of talk.

Post these tips in a common area so all adults (and even older children) can use them.

The 14 Talking Tips

Use these tips to increase words and turns when talking, reading, or singing with a child.

- Talk about what you're doing and thinking.
- 2. Comment on what they're doing or looking at.
- 3. Name things that they're interested in.
- 4. Get down to their level: face to face.
- 5. Touch, hug, hold.
- **6.** Tune in and respond to what they look at, do, and say.
- 7. Wait for their response.
- 8. Imitate them, and add words.
- 9. Make faces, use gestures.
- 10. Take turns don't do all the talking.
- 11. Repeat and add to what they say and do.
- 12. Follow their lead, do what interests them.
- **13.** Encourage them, be positive.
- 14. Be silly! Relax and have fun!
