- 1. Spring Athletic Coaches: MS Baseball and Girls on the Run
 - a. I recommended approval of Shawn Bunkelman and Jeremy Apfelbeck for MS Baseball Coaches and Sara Tatro as GOTR Head Coach and Sarah Baltus and Samantha Brown as GOTR Assistant Coaches. The School Board approved these recommendations.

Policy

- Neola Updates: 1st Reading (January Updates: #1130, 1422, 1662, 2260, 2270, 2700.01, 3120, 3122, 3139, 3140, 3143, 3230, 3362, 4139, 4122, 4230, 4362, 5111, 5114, 5341, 5512, 5517, 6150, 6220, 6235, 6440, 6520, 8330, 9130, 9150)
 - a. Neola prepares updates and revisions to the policies throughout the year and then these updates are sent to me twice a year. This process typically occurs in June and December. I have received the legal updates and met with our Neola representative to discuss the updates. The School Board approved these updates for 1st reading.
- 2. 2018-19 School Calendar: Snow Make Up Days
 - a. I recommended approval of this plan to make up our snow days:
 - i. Days 1 (Jan 28) and 2 (Jan 30) were "built into our calendar" so no need to make up
 - ii. Day 3 (Jan 31): We will have a full day of school on Thursday, April 18th
 - iii. Day 4 (Feb 4): We will have a full day of school on Monday, April 22
 - iv. Day 5 (Feb 7): Change our current 1/2 inservice days (March 17 and May 15) to full days of school
 - v. Day 6: (Feb 12): Not decided yet--Potentially add minutes to the day, but wait to see if we have more snow days

The School Board approved the make-up recommendations for snow days 1-5. Snow day #6 has not been determined yet.

Finance

- 1. CESA 9 Service Contract 2019-20
 - a. I recommended approval of the CESA 9 contract for 2019-20 for the amount of \$28,561.00. The services we purchase from CESA 9 will be the same as this year's services. The projected costs are up slightly from this year's cost of \$27,354.00 (+\$1,207.00) The School Board approved the 2019-20 CESA 9 Service Contract.
- 2. CESA 10 Services Contract 2019-20
 - a. The estimated cost for the services for CWETN for 2019-20 is \$13,605.00. This is an increase of \$396 from the 2018-19 contract \$13,209.00). The School Board approved the 2019-20 CESA 10 Service Contract.
